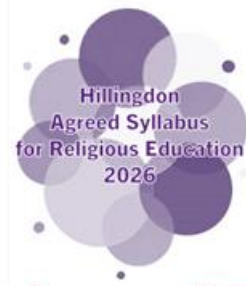


New Hillingdon Agreed Syllabus is here!

We are proud to announce the launch of the new **Locally Agreed Syllabus** following an in-depth collaborative review process with subject leaders across schools and faith groups in the community.

This **syllabus** will support *all* schools in planning a curriculum that goes beyond **Ofsted** expectations to enable pupils to engage effectively in a multicultural society with a clear, simple model which continues to promote interbelief dialogue and work towards strengthening community cohesion.

We explain how to select different types of knowledge and plan learning around key concepts, and how to sequence learning in your **curriculum** as part of a clear narrative with a continuous building of skills. Last academic year all **secondary** schools were invited to join a special online Pupils' Interfaith Conference programme with speakers from 6 religions and worldviews giving their responses to religious persecution based around the question: **"Why remember?"**
