**RE: SORTED** substance use and misuse support offer for children in year 6 and their parents/caregivers

Dear Headteacher/Head of Year

With the Summer Term fast approaching your Year 6 students will be preparing for their transition from primary to secondary school. The London Borough of Hillingdons' Substance Use and Misuse team (SORTED) have devised a package of support which includes workshops and webinars to address children's vulnerabilities with regards substance misuse and child exploitation and support to parents/caregivers. Our SORTED team have historically worked in senior schools across the borough however, we have, in response to growing concerns locally and nationally that children and young people are being exposed to teenage substance use earlier, expanded our education and prevention offer to primary schools. We are seeking to support schools to prevent their pupils' potential engagement in risky behaviours and raise awareness of the risk of grooming and child exploitation.

## The Offer

- 1. <u>Two 50 min workshops for students</u> interactive games video links, small group tasks and discussion. The workshop will be delivered by an experienced Lead Programme Delivery Worker
  - Workshop 1 most commonly used drugs and risks of using alcohol and nicotine-based products.
  - <u>Workshop 2</u> risks of using cannabis grooming, grooming cycle and child criminal exploitation.
- 2. <u>One hour workshop for parents</u> to enable parents to recognise and identify the risk factors involved in substance misuse and child exploitation in the wider community setting. The workshop will be delivered by an experienced qualified counsellor

These workshops for students and parents will be available from 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023 until 14<sup>th</sup> July on Thursdays and Fridays.

3. Online One Hour Webinar for Parents – Borough wide offer for parents who cannot attend face to face workshops in their child's school. The webinar will be delivered by an experienced qualified counsellor
