#### A message from the Director of SEND and Inclusion



Dear Colleagues

Firstly, I wanted to introduce myself to you all. I am the new Director of Education and SEND – I am now at the end of my first full week back in Hillingdon and I am looking forward to meeting lots of you over the next few months. My background is that I was previously a Headteacher in a neighbouring Borough and have been a SENCO for many years. I was previously the Head of Education and Learning for Hillingdon, and, prior to my new role, I was a Director in Luton Borough Council, where I led on Education and SEND.

The majority of my experience in SEND has been as a SENCO and school leader so I am very aware of the challenges schools face with managing SEND needs and the importance of the support from the Local Authority when supporting our diverse range of needs.

As we approach the end of this academic year, I wanted to say a big thank you to you all for your hard work and dedication in supporting children with SEND and your collaborative approach to working with the SEND teams in Hillingdon. I am keen to understand over the coming months what is working well and look for any further opportunities to support schools with SEND moving forwards. Please do share any feedback with either the SEND management team or myself as we are keen to look at ways we can work together to ensure our SEND children have the best outcomes.

On a final note, I wanted to share a recent news article that truly inspired me. Jason Arday recently was in the press for becoming the youngest black professor ever appointed to the University of Cambridge. Whilst this is an incredible achievement, the most amazing aspect of this story is that Jason was diagnosed with global developmental delay and ASD and was non-verbal until the age of 11. This story is an example of what our children can achieve with the right support. It is key that we do not ever consider our children to have a ceiling on what we think they can achieve, irrespective of SEND needs. You can read more about Jason's inspirational story in this link.

## **NASEN – Preparing for Adulthood**

Preparation for Adulthood from the Earliest Years

It has been nearly nine years since the ideas around Preparing for Adulthood from the Early Years (PfAEY) emerged and the expectations on schools to prepare all young people for adult life through personal development have grown in that time.

Preparing for Adulthood is what all schools do for all young people – but that offer is not always drawn together and recognised. Our refreshed 'Preparing for Adulthood from the Earliest Years' Review Guide was trialled with schools in Oxfordshire who found that taking part in the process resulted in:

- A clear focus and drive for school improvement
- More widely shared expertise and good practice
- Better understanding of the rationale of PfAEY
- A clear and strategic vision for embedding PfAEY
- A named PfAEY governor.

As part of the Universal SEND Services programme, we will be recruiting 80 nursery, primary, secondary and school sixth form settings to carry out a review in the Autumn term of 2023. Settings will receive training and support to carry out the review and will be encouraged to produce an analysis report and action plan. Participating schools will also have an opportunity to cascade PfAEY training and support to a partner school the following year.

### **Investment in Internships**

The Department for Education (DfE) has announced the Internships Work consortium and the British Association of Supported Employment (BASE) as the chosen delivery partners for an £18 million investment in the Supported Internships programme.

The new Internships Work programme will deliver on a commitment set out in the SEND and AP green paper.

The Internships Work programme includes the National Development Team for Inclusion (NDTi), BASE, and DFN Project SEARCH. It will work closely with local authorities to double the number of supported internships by 2025, engaging with employers and young people to level up the quality of Supported Internships across the programme.



Access to a NASEN led workshop, only available to Hillingdon schools signed up for a review.

If commissioned through NASEN, the cost of a SEND Review is £1,200 for primary schools and £2,300 for secondary. We are offering a supported SEND Review at no cost to your setting.

#### The Process

- 1. Identification Setting requests a SEND review (contact below)
- Self-Evaluation Setting completes a self-evaluation of current provision
  Preparation The PSA will request preparatory information, analyse data, and confirm a
- programme for their visit
- Site visit The PSA will visit your setting, undertake joint learning walks, engage in discussions with key staff / parents / students and at the end of the day, meet with SLT to discuss strengths and areas of development
- Reporting The PSA submits a written report, based on verbal discussions, within a timescale agreed with the school
- 6. Follow up The setting may agree follow up visits and support

## An inspirational Story...

"I have just returned from the special Olympics where 170 countries and over 7000 athletes took part. Team GB had 82 athletes taking part. My Nephew Ryan Griffin took part at 16 years of age he was the youngest Athlete on the Irish team. Ryan has Downs syndrome alongside this he has communication difficulties.

Ryan first threw the Javelin in January when the family found out he had been selected for the Special Olympics in Berlin and the family is so proud that he won Silver in the World Special Olympics.

The amazing support from volunteers throughout the Olympics was outstanding. As a family the support for Ryan and the family throughout his life has been fantastic and shows what effective early intervention and the correct support can do to support achievement."
