AXIS SERVICE BULLETIN

You would have noticed AXIS Service has been having a mini-hiatus, and took a break to really explore the most effective ways to update our professionals/ partners, alongside offering tools and resources to work with and around our children in Hillingdon.

We would like to remind you all that AXIS is a prevention service rather than a step down service. We have recently made some changes to our eligibility criteria regarding Young People that we can work with. We understand that many of our children require support/interventions within our remit, however we cannot work with Young People who are on a CP/CIN plan or LAC.

This is due to duplication of work and the overwhelming amount of professionals who are already involved with our children within statutory service.

AXIS are now able to provide consultations with referrers to further assess if our Axis workers can provide short term bespoke interventions alongside professionals or provide resources and further signposting/guidance to support the concerns that have been raised.



AXIS OVERVIEW: 2023

From 2023, the overall number of children aged 10- 17yrs old identified as vulnerable to extrafamilial harm was 431, with just a 2% increase of identifications, compared to 2022 where identifications were 423. The data from 2023 shows that the average age of children coming to the attention of AXIS at the time of referral as 17 years old, indicating the importance of transitional stages into young adulthood for our vulnerable children, and what support is available from a community lense. The overall representation for extra-familial harm was held by boys at 69%, and girls at 31%. In 2023 AXIS saw a reduction on serious youth violence activity overall by 5%, especially within the months October - December. AXIS saw a significant rise in themes pertaining to Anti-Social Behaviour, which continues to be explored and further understood to support eider partners in prevention and diversion. AXIS's majority of engagement at 62% was with children who were not open to any services, or known to the borough, which continues to indicate the power and importance of early prevention.

Patterns, Trends and Themes

Hotspots Robbery/SYV

Uxbridge town centre, Uxbridge Tube Station, Hayes Town.

Robberies remain to be a main area of concern, type of crime: phone snatches, DPD driver attacks, expensive jackets and random attacks.

It has been reported young people are drinking in a local pub – this has been raised with licensing. Please continue to share with AXIS any locations of concern.


Police have seen an increase in robberies of school children and suspect this is due to the new gifts they would have received over Christmas.

Our aim is to prevent children and young people becoming involved in crime or anti-social behaviour by offering support and one 2 one mentoring to them and their families.

The programme relies on early intervention in the lives of the children and young people to prevent further offending and entering the criminal justice system. We are separate from official agencies such as the Police or Social Services.

Does this mean I am in trouble?

No! The idea is to help you and your family make positive changes before any trouble happens. Do I have to go through with this?

No, it is entirely your choice, but you could be missing out on a real chance to turn your life around.

... It's your life, it's your choice but let us help you make the right one.

- Mondays to Thursdays, 11:00-15:30 at the Lyric Hammersmith
- All travel expenses covered and lunch provided for the whole programme
- Accredited Arts Award qualification for all participants who complete the course
- Young people have to be based in the 10 West London boroughs: Brent, Ealing,
 Hammersmith & Fulham, Harrow, Hillingdon, Hounslow, Kensington and Chelsea, Richmond
 upon Thames, Wandsworth and Westminster

The 6 weeks of work accumulate in a performance for family & friends at the Lyric Hammersmith
Theatre on Wednesday 13 March 2024.

This is a flagship programme for 16 to 25 year olds called START, an accredited six week training course for NEET (not in education, employment or training) young people with the aim of reengaging them in education, employment or training.

Throughout the six weeks 10 young people will broaden their perspectives by developing a range of characters and scenarios and rehearsing alternative behaviours in a safe environment. With two professional directors they explore issues which are relevant to their own lives and foster a group ethic of inclusivity, accessibility, encouragement, respect and affirmation whilst creating their own original piece of theatre which they will perform at the end of the course. For many this alternative form of engaging with skills development and the responsibilities of team work is the first time they have been willing to learn. This project is underpinned by an Arts Award accreditation.
