The delivery of the 5-week 14-16 SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) Business Enterprise Programme focuses on providing students with the opportunity to develop practical skills related to entrepreneurship and business operations. The programme will be tailored to meet the diverse needs of students, offering a supportive and inclusive learning environment. Over the five weeks, students are introduced to key business concepts such as marketing, finance, product development, and customer service. The curriculum will be designed to engage students through interactive activities, group work, and real-world scenarios that encourage problemsolving, communication, and teamwork. In addition to the core business skills, the SEND Business Enterprise Programme emphasizes the development of transferable life skills. These include building self-confidence, time management, decision-making, and collaborative skills.

Programme outline

- Students brought by minibus to UC by school or travel independently
