Delivery:

ASEND provides flexible delivery methods, including:

- Face-to-Face Support: In-person sessions conducted in various settings such as homes, schools, or community centres.

- 1:1 Sessions: Individualized support focusing on personalised learning and development.
- Group Sessions: Small group interactions to promote social skills and collaborative learning.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** BSOC caters to learners starting from age 14 to 25, with programs designed for school-aged students and adults seeking to enter or advance in the construction industry.
- Specialisation: For those with Educational Health Care Plans (EHCPs).

Delivery:

- **In-Person Training:** BSOC offers hands-on training in their workshops located in Hayes and Hounslow, providing practical experience in various construction trades.

Cohort:

- Age Range: Post-16 learners (16–25) including EHCP learners and those with additional needs
- Target Audience: Post-16 young people who are not thriving in traditional FE settings. Those with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs). Students with Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs. Learners with autism, learning Disabilities, physical disabilities and non-verbal communicators, young people who are care-experienced or at risk of disengagement.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** KCL operates a hub-and-spoke model, combining structured education, life skills, and therapeutic support in real-world and alternative settings. They offer several approaches including:
- Group sessions
- Face-to-Face Group Learning farm and hub-based
- 1:1 trauma informed Tuition -online, home-based or centre-based
- Virtual Learning secure platform with live/recorded sessions
- **Subjects:** Functional Skills in English and Math's, Digital Skills, Agricultural Training and Land-Based Occupational Studies, PEARL Employability Awards and Independent Living Skills
- **Support Services:** Keyworker support and mentoring, therapeutic sessions, Sensory regulation sessions, and communication support.

Timescales:

- Flexible duration: 6-12 week courses, medium term placements (1-2 terms) or longer placements.
- **Start Dates:** Rolling admissions placements can begin at any point during the academic year subject to availability and learner suitability.

Packages:

In addition to those with EAL/ESOL requirements, looked-after children, young offenders, and those not in education, employment, or training (NEET).
- **Student Needs**: Designed to re-engage students through a structured, interactive online learning environment.
- Supports students with personalised learning paths, helping them stay on track academically.
- Provides a safeguarded setting with real-time monitoring to ensure student well-being.

Delivery:

- Online classes: self-paced lessons combined with real-time tutor support during school hours.
- Interactive assessments and feedback to track progress.
- Secure monitoring tools for attendance, engagement, and safeguarding.

Timescales:

- **Duration:** Short-term placements (weeks to months) for reintegration support. Long-term options for students needing full-time alternative provision.
- Start Dates: Rolling enrolment allows students to start at any time throughout the year.

Packages:

- **Curriculum**: Follows the National Curriculum and covers core GCSE subjects such as Maths, English, Science, History, and Geography.

Cohort:

• **Age Range:** EOB Academy caters to students aged 12 to 25 who have struggled or failed in mainstream education settings.

• **Specialisation:** The academy focuses on neurodiverse learners, providing an inclusive environment tailored to their unique learning preferences.

Delivery:

- Course Offerings: EOB Academy provides courses in;
- Video Game Design at levels 1-3 in Bracknell, Letchworth and online- 39 weeks
- Music ie. Performance and Production which students can receive an award, certificate or diploma for upon completion- 6 or 39 weeks available at either the Berkshire or Hertfordshire site.
- Business start up in fashion available in Letchworth or online- 39 weeks
- My life, my way, life skills preparing for adulthood available in Letchworth or online- 39 weeks
- Functional English & Math's- at Hertfordshire *only-* **Please note** that this is a *secondary add on to other courses* mentioned above.

Packages:

• **Customised Learning Paths:** EOB Academy offers various levels tailored to different ages and abilities, ensuring that each student receives an education suited to their individual needs and goals.



Fast Forward Vocational Training

Fast Forward Vocational Training is designed to be flexible and supportive, aiming to equip young people with the skills and qualifications they need to succeed within engineering and mechanics.

Cohort:

• Other avenues: FSIE also offer Functional Skills, BTECs, ASDAN accredited courses and Vocational Tasters.

Timescales:

- **Duration**: Programs can vary in length, ranging from a few weeks to a full academic year or more, depending on the student's progress and the goals set for them.
- **Start Dates**: Entry points can be flexible, with multiple intakes throughout the year to accommodate new students as needed.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods**: Utilises a mix of one-on-one tutoring, small group sessions, online learning, and practical hands-on training. The focus is on engaging students through interactive and supportive learning environments.

- **Student Needs**: Designed to support individuals who need an alternative route to education and employment.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods**: Combines classroom-based learning, workshops, hands-on practical training, and work placements. The approach is interactive and student-centered to engage learners effectively.
- **Vocational Training**: Offers a range of vocational courses in sectors such as construction, hospitality, healthcare, IT, and business. These are aimed at building practical skills that are directly applicable to employment.
- **Online Learning**: Includes flexible online courses that allow students to study at their own pace, complementing in-person sessions and providing additional support.

Timescales:

- **Duration**: Programs vary from short courses (a few weeks) to more extended training periods (several months or a year) depending on the student's progress and the specific training requirements.

They also support young people to find employment and career opportunities.

Cohort:

- Target Audience: They support children and young people between the ages of 7 to 25.
- **Student Needs:** Power 2 supports those who are; struggling with SEMH and SEN needs including those with or without an EHCP, from low-income households, looked after children and pupils who are disengaged from school.

Delivery:

- **Mentoring**: One to one and group mentoring programmes equip children and young people with practical and emotional based strategies to help them cope with daily challenges and ongoingly post intervention.
- Work- based experiences: Support is available over 18s who are currently in further or higher education that were previously in receipt of free school meals with aspirations. This support involves workplace visits, employer and business challenges, paid internships or placements with Power 2's partners.
- **Independence building:** Care experienced young people aged 16-25 are supported to pursue education, access training and employment via Power 2's Advance programme.

NB: Please note that Power 2 offers additional programmes to the ones listed above.

Timescales:

- Programmes typically last around 16 weeks.
- Longer term support is also available for up to three years.

Packages:

• **Wellbeing- first approach:** Face to face support is available to help children and young people develop their skills, grow in confidence and thrive.

Randstad Alternative Provision aims to provide a supportive and flexible educational environment that helps young people gain the skills, qualifications, and confidence needed to progress into further education or employment. They are part of the National Tutoring Programme (NTP) and their support is delivered through a tuition service tailored to individual learning needs. In addition to the above they also offer, 'The Randstad Home Language Programme.'

Cohort:

• Target Audience:

Randstad are able to provide tutors to schools from early years through to age 18, including:

Those at risk of exclusion; pupils with complex needs; ESOL/EAL learners; those with special educational needs (SEN); youth offenders; and students who are NEET (Not in Education, Employment, or Training).

Delivery:

• **Teaching Methods**: Students can access one to one or small group tutoring which can be face to face or online. The approach is designed to be flexible and tailored to meet individual learning styles.

Packages:

• Student Needs: Provides personalised learning plans to support students in re-engaging with education and developing the skills needed for future success.

Reed Education Recuitment is an education recruitment and supply teachers agency who are also able to provide tutors as part of the National Tutoring Programme, (NTP). Remedy Tutors

Remedy Tutors provides, 'School-led tutoring', which is part of the National Tutoring Program, (NTP), made available by the government to eligible state-funded schools and academies. The NTP is a grant scheme designed specifically to help schools to access funding to close the widened education gap experienced by vulnerable and disadvantaged pupils affected by the Covid-19 lockdown.

The aim of the grant being to fund locally sourced tutors for these pupils to reduce the financial burden on eligible state funded education settings.

Cohort:

- For all ages- can be from reception up until age 25 (ie. for pupils with SEN/ EHCP funding).
- Also available for ESOL learners, unaccompanied asylum seeking children and LAC.

Delivery:

- Online or in person- tuition is made available in a format which suits the needs of the child or young person in agreement with their education setting.
- Individual or group sessions- available for all ages.

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Timescales:

- **Duration**: depends on the length of time given by the referrer ie. if the education setting says between two weeks or specifies they want support ongoingly.
- Tutors can be provided throughout the academic year, including outside of term time.

Packages:

- Education settings are able to access a dedicated lead consultant providing one point of contact for all enquiries.
- Subject specialist tutors: who are carefully selected and dependable.



Welcome to Spectrum Tutors

Spectrum Tutors Alternative Provision aims to provide a supportive and adaptable learning environment that meets the unique needs of each student, helping them gain skills, qualifications, and confidence to succeed in further education or employment.

Cohort:

- Target Audience: Aimed at students in KS1-5 who have disengaged from mainstream education, have behavioral
 issues, special educational needs (SEN), including those with or without an EHCP or who are at risk of exclusion.
- Student Needs: Focuses on re-engaging students through personalised and flexible learning approaches.

Delivery:

• **Teaching Methods**: One to one in-person tutoring which can take place in pupils home or schools or in public buildings such as libraries, online learning, distance learning with phone and email support for pupils or blended learning. The delivery is designed to be interactive and tailored to individual learning styles.

Timescales:

- **Duration**: Programs vary in length depending on the individual student's progress and needs. The minimum package is one calendar month and support can be provided on an ongoing basis if requested.

Cohort:

- **Target Audience**: Caters for students aged 4-18. The AP program is tailored for students facing challenges such as behavioral issues, mental health concerns, trauma, health concerns, or those who are disengaged from mainstream education
- Student Needs: Program is designed to support students who may not thrive in traditional educational settings

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods**: Sophia High School's Alternative Provision delivers education entirely online, combining live, real-time instruction with small group sessions and individualised support. Classes are led by British-trained teachers and enhanced with immersive technologies such as virtual reality to boost engagement. The approach is student-centered, with flexible pacing and personalised learning pathways that are supportive and adaptive to each learner's needs.
- **Curriculum:** The provision offers a broad, flexible curriculum aligned with the UK National Curriculum, covering core subjects like English, Mathematics, and Science. In addition, Sophia High School provides enrichment

- options tailored to student interests and needs, including project-based learning and thematic units. While vocational training is not delivered in a traditional hands-on setting, the school incorporates career education and future skills development through online modules and mentorship.

 online offering, Sophia High School encourages career readiness through virtual career days, industry expert

Timescales:

Star Player AP operates an in person targeted youth support and enrichment provision either on the premises of education settings or off site with a focus on using sport to foster resilience, emotional regulation skills, physical and/ or psychological wellbeing.

Cohort:

- They work in collaboration with a range of institutions including nurseries, mainstream schools and pupil referral units across Hounslow, Bournemouth and Surrey with plans to expand this into Hillingdon.
- Pupils they can support include those from age 5 upwards, those with or without an EHCP and those at risk/ who have been excluded.

Delivery:

• Support includes one to one football coaching, a choice of sports activities, Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) camps for those in receipt of FSM and/ or SEN, behavioural and mentoring support and support accessing tutoring to obtain basic Maths and English (Functional Skills- level 1).

Timescale:

• Packages of support can start from 2 months up to one year and is available at any time of year.



Trauma-Informed Alternative Provision | Targeted Provision

Targeted Provision Alternative Provision focuses on creating a supportive and adaptive learning environment that addresses individual student needs, helping them to re-engage with education, achieve qualifications, and prepare for future employment or further education.

Cohort:

- **Target Audience**: Aimed at students aged 11-19 who have disengaged from mainstream education, have behavioral issues, special educational needs (SEN), learning difficulties, or are NEET (Not in Education, Employment, or Training). The provision is also suitable for students at risk of exclusion or who have faced previous academic failure.
- **Student Needs**: Tailored to meet individual needs and re-engage students with education through targeted interventions.

Delivery:

- Teaching Methods: Offers in-person one to one and small group sessions, online learning,
- **Curriculum**: Offers a balanced curriculum that includes core academic subjects (math, English, science) alongside vocational training in areas such as IT, hospitality, business, and construction. The curriculum is designed to provide both academic qualifications and practical skills.

Timescales:

- **Duration**: Programs vary in length from a few weeks to an entire academic year or longer, depending on individual student needs and progress. Some may be shorter interventions focused on immediate skills development, while others may involve longer-term engagement for more comprehensive support.
- **Start Dates**: Flexible entry points throughout the year allow students to start their program at different times, accommodating varying schedules and needs.

Packages:

• **Curriculum**: Designed to provide a blend of academic and vocational education. Students may work towards achieving qualifications such as GCSEs, functional skills

• **Support Services**: Includes personalised support such as mentoring, career counseling, job search skills, and access to mental health resources. Each student may also have an individual learning plan to track progress and adjust strategies as needed.



TCES Group - About TCES

TCES Alternative Provision aims to provide a supportive, flexible, and personalised learning environment that addresses the individual needs of students and helps them achieve their full potential academically, socially, and emotionally.

Cohort:

• Target Audience: Aimed at students aged 7-25 who have disengaged from mainstream education or who have/ are experiencing a range of other difficulties. Such as students who have; behavioural issues; experienced Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), with SEN- with or without an EHCP- medical needs and or SEMH, Autism Spectrum Condition or those who are at risk of exclusion/ have been excluded. (Please note this is not an exhaustive list)

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods**: Uses a combination of online small teaching groups, online learning, and hands-on practical sessions. The delivery is flexible and personalised to suit different learning styles and needs.
- Curriculum: Offers a broad curriculum that includes core academic subjects (ie. Maths, English, Science)
- **Holistic Support**: Integrates mental health and well-being support, speech and language therapy, emotional support, and behavioral interventions. There is a strong emphasis on developing life skills and building self-esteem.

Timescales:

- **Student Needs**: Designed to provide a supportive, non-traditional learning environment that meets individual learning styles and needs.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods**: Combines classroom learning in small group sizes, small group sessions, online courses, workshops, and hands-on training. The approach is interactive and focused on practical learning experiences.
- **Vocational Training**: Offers a range of vocational courses such as construction, hospitality, IT, retail, and healthcare. These courses are designed to equip students with skills directly applicable to the workforce.
- **Flexibility**: Includes flexible learning options to accommodate students' varying schedules, including part-time, full-time, and online learning.

Timescales:

- **Duration**: Programs vary in length, ranging from a few weeks to a full academic year or longer, depending on the individual's needs and goals. Some courses are intensive, designed for quick skills acquisition, while others provide a more gradual progression.

- **Student Needs:** The provision focuses on engaging students with learning, facilitating access to the curriculum, supporting transitions back into mainstream education, and supporting transitions back into secondary education.
