In the UK, all children in Year 8 (ages 12–13) are offered the HPV (Human Papillomavirus) vaccine.

Did you know?

The HPV vaccine helps prevent up to 90% of cervical cancers and can also protect against some mouth and throat cancers. It is offered to both boys and girls to protect against the human papillomavirus, which can cause these serious health conditions.

ARE YOU HOME SCHOOLING A CHILD IN YEAR 9, 10 OR 11?

Children aged 14 and over are eligible for the 3-in-1 Teenage Booster (DTP) and the Meningitis ACWY (MenACWY) vaccines.

- The 3-in-1 Teenage Booster (DTP) protects against Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Polio. This booster strengthens the protection your child received as a baby, as immunity can decrease over time.
- The MenACWY vaccine protects against four strains of meningitis (A, C, W, and Y). Meningitis is a serious infection that causes inflammation of the brain and spinal cord and can lead to severe health complications or even be life-threatening.



If your child is in Year 9 or above and has missed these important vaccinations, scan the QR code to book an appointment.
