Pupils' Interfaith Dialogue Conference

This programme will include an introductory/pre-session for teachers to run in school with your chosen pupils to begin engaging with the key words and concepts and prepare for the online event. We already have speakers lined up from 6 religions and worldviews for the online conference, and there will be a fully resourced reflective session for pupils who attended the online event. This will include evaluation materials and opportunities for pupils to respond through artwork and other media to the big question "why remember?"
