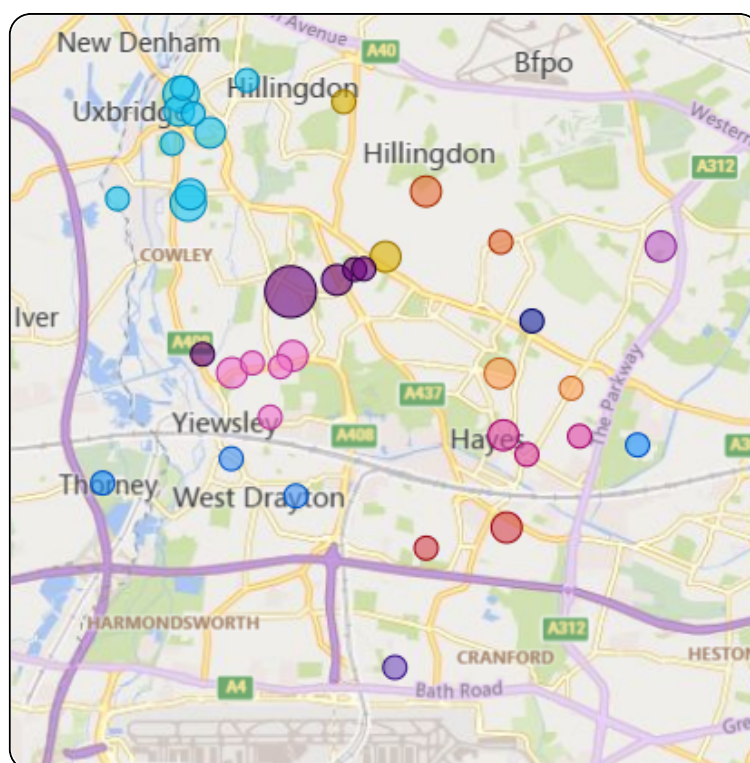
Intelligence Flow & Custody Trends

AXIS has noted a **seasonal rise in intelligence submissions** which is an expected outcome since the **commencement of the Autumn** and the evenings becoming **darker, earlier**.

SYV and ASB remains our main intelligence and **most common reason** for entering custody, with many young people on **police bail** and continues to remain as a discussion point on the agenda at a **strategic and operational level**.

Geographic Risk Concentration

A **heat map analysis** below highlights **Uxbridge and Yiewsley** as hotspots with **Hayes and Hillingdon** as emerging hotspots.



Serious Youth Violence (SYV) & Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

Due to potential seasonal increase, AXIS note that **ASB incidents** have increased from **9** to **14** incident in this reporting period. **13-16years** are the main age groups coming to notice for **ASB incidents**.

93% of ASB incidents related to **boys** with the main concern around incidents within **Hayes, Ruislip and Cowley**.

SYV remains a top concern for the Borough, AXIS have noted **30** children coming to notice for **SYV related incidents**. During reporting period there were **38** pieces of intelligence/incidents relating to SYV.

84% of SYV cases involved **boys** this reporting period, and the main age for SYV related incidents were **17yrs** and **13yrs**.

SYV main concern appears to be **robberies where violence is used or group assaults**, a **knife** was mentioned on **17 occasions**.

Areas of concern for SYV related incidents are: **Uxbridge, Cowley, Yiewsley & Hayes**. With **Ruislip and West Drayton** mentioned on one occasion.

Robbery of personal items including **mobile phones, earpods and jackets** seems to be increasing going into the darker months, as such we remind everyone to **stay vigilant and report anything to 101**.

SYV & ASB Response

AXIS has identified a **number of incidents** happening at the **end of the school day** and continue to work **alongside police, schools and the detached team** to highlight areas of concern and plan strategic approaches to de-escalation.

SYV workshops continue to be delivered within schools and we will be **piloting** the **involvement of parents/carers** within these at our next sessions including input from **Family Lives**.

Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) & VAWG

Number of children coming to notice for **CSE related incidents** has continued to **decline** to **6** in comparison to **7** last reporting period. There was **12** pieces of intelligence/ incidents reported overall.

1 CSE related incidents was linked to **VAWG incidents**.

70% of those who came to notice, **were girls**.

The main **areas of concern** for **CSE related incidents** in this reporting period is **Yiewsley, Hillingdon Ward and Uxbridge**.

The **main theme** for **CSE** related incidents is **sexual assaults** and one incident of **viewing child pornography online**.

Instagram and Snapchat most **cited platforms** for this reporting period for **grooming and image distribution**.

Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE Response)

CSE remains a standing agenda item across **strategic panels e.g. Operational High Risk Panel, MAROTH**.

AXIS continues to collaborate with the **Metropolitan Police CSE Lead and KISS (Sexual Health Service)** to address **CSE**.

Drugs: Trends & Emerging Themes

Drug-related incidents saw a slight increase with **9** children being linked to **drug-related incidents** during this reporting period, in comparison to **5** previously. There was overall, **10 pieces of intelligence or incidents reported**.

80% of drug-related incidents involved **boys**.

Personal possession and **smoking of Cannabis** dominated the intelligence received by AXIS.

One **drug-related incident** also involved a large **machete-style knife**.

One block of flats was identified as a potential area **young people frequent to smoke cannabis** and this was highlighted to **community safety and ASB teams**.

The **main area of concern** for drug-related incidents was **Uxbridge**, but **Hayes and West Drayton** were mentioned on one occasion. **2 drug related incidents** involved **Hillingdon children**, but the incident was **outside of LBH**.

County Lines

There was **1 piece** of intelligence received regarding **County Lines**.

Drug Response

Information around drugs continues to be an integral part of our **AXIS workshops and interventions**.

AXIS continues to work in **partnership with SORTED**.

Missing Persons (MISPER)

11 children were reported missing of which **64%** were **girls**, during this reporting period. Overall, **22** Missing Episodes were recorded.

17 was the **main age of children** who were reported missing.

The **main area of concern** linked to **Missing Episodes** was **Uxbridge**, with **Hayes and Yeading** being mentioned on **1 occasion**.

Common themes continue to be: being “out with friends/boyfriends” and travelling to London.

2 incidents of children returning home after being reported missing ‘**Under the influence**’.

Looked After Children (LAC) are frequently reported missing due to curfew breaches, returning home late or family visits. **AXIS intelligence** suggests that **87% of missing episodes** reported related to a child who is **LAC**. This is in part down to the **robust reporting mechanisms** of those who provide care for those children.

MISPER Response

AXIS continues to work closely with **police, social care, and Youth Justice Services**, ensuring rapid **information sharing and coordinated action** to reduce harm.

There has recently been a **renewed drive to expedite Strategy Meetings** for Missing Children.
