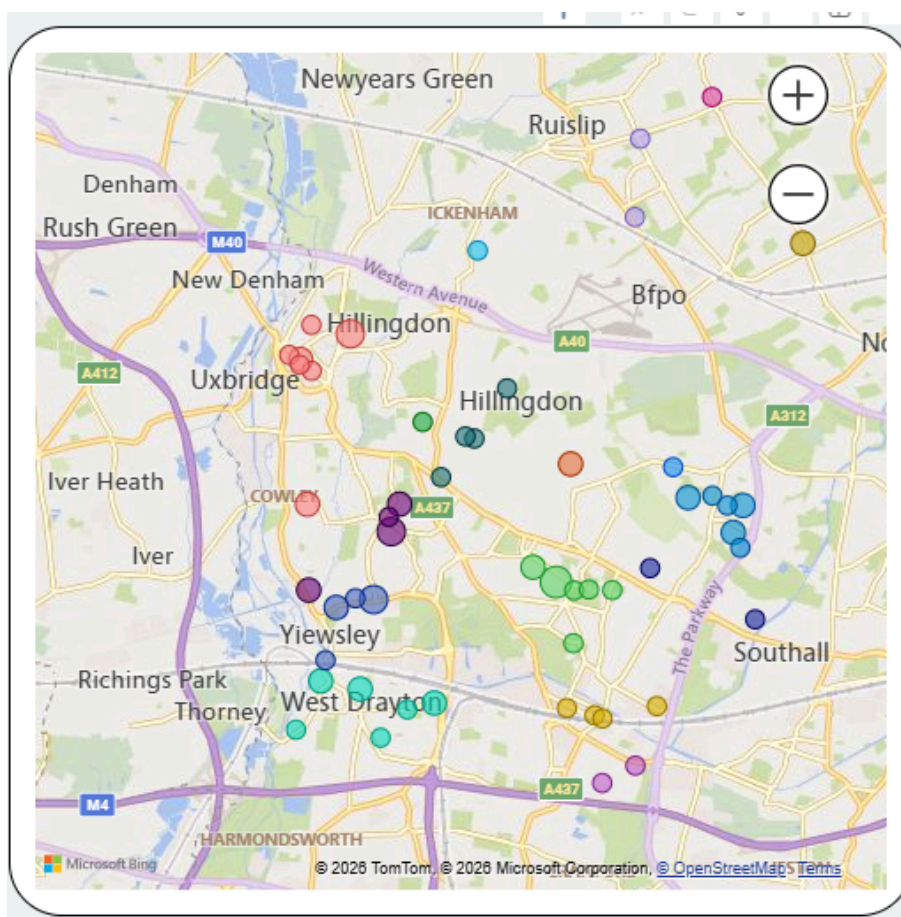
A strategic overview of youth safety, risk trends and multi-agency responses across Hillingdon

## Intelligence Flow & Custody Trends

**SYV and ASB** features heavily across this months intelligence picture. Ongoing conversations around these areas are being had at a **strategic and operational level**.

## Geographic Risk Concentration

A **heat map analysis** below highlights **Hayes and Uxbridge** as hotspots with **West Drayton, Yiewsley and West Drayton** as emerging hotspots.



## Serious Youth Violence (SYV) & Antisocial Behaviour (ASB).

AXIS note that **ASB incidents** have increased from **9** to **11** incidents in this reporting period. **17 years** is the main age group coming to notice for **ASB incidents**.

**82%** of **ASB incidents** related to **boys**, with the main concern around incidents within **Uxbridge**, with **Cowley, Hayes, West Drayton and Yiewsley** all having one incident noted.

**SYV** remains a top concern for the Borough, **AXIS** have noted a slight **decrease** to **51 from 57** children coming to notice for SYV related incidents within this reporting period. During reporting period there were **64 pieces of intelligence/incidents** relating to SYV compared to **58 last reporting period**.

**67%** of SYV cases **involved boys** this reporting period, and the **main age** for SYV related incidents were **13yrs and 17yrs**.

**SYV** main concern appears to be **physical assaults** which are taking place in **school or after school**, and **robberies of personal items** which involve an assault. A **knife** was mentioned on **23 occasions**.

**Areas of concern** for SYV related incidents are: **Uxbridge, Hayes and West Drayton**. With **Ruislip and Yiewsley** noting incidents.

### **SYV & ASB Response**

**AXIS** have identified a number of incidents happening at the **end of the school day** and continue to work alongside **police, schools and the detached team** to highlight **areas of concern and plan strategic approaches** to de-escalation.

**AXIS** continues to deliver group sessions within schools relating to **SYV**. Recent feedback from students who took part states **90%** would recommend the group sessions to others. **100% participants** stated they would **like to take part again**.

## Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) & VAWG

Reporting of **CSE incidents has increased** this reporting period from **6 to 10** children coming to notice for **CSE** related incidents. There were **10 pieces of intelligence/ incidents** reported overall.

**60%** of those who came to notice, were **boys** this reporting period.

The **main areas of concern** for CSE related incidents in this reporting period is **Northwood** with **Cowley, Harefield, West Drayton, Hayes and Yiwsley** all noting one incident.

The main theme for **CSE related incidents** is **sharing of indecent images on social media and sexual assaults**. One incident where **trafficking** was mentioned.

**TikTok and Snapchat** remain the most cited platforms for **grooming and image distribution** this reporting period.

## Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) Response

**CSE** remains a standing agenda item across strategic panels e.g. **Operational High Risk Panel, MAROTH**.

AXIS continues to **collaborate** with the **Metropolitan Police CSE Lead and KISS (Sexual Health Service)** to address **CSE**.

## Drugs: Trends & Emerging Theme

AXIS saw a slight increase with **11** children being linked to **drug-related incidents** during this reporting period, in comparison to **7** previously.

**11 pieces of intelligence or incidents reported.**

**91%** of drug-related incidents involved **boys**.

**Personal possession and smoking of Cannabis** dominated the intelligence received by AXIS.

Incidents of being **intoxicated using alcohol or drugs** and **attending A&E** as identified as a theme this reporting period. **Unknown white pills** were mentioned on **2 occasions** and **Lean** mentioned on one occasion.

The **main area of concern** for drug-related incidents is **Cowley, Ickenham, Hayes Yiewsley**.

## County Lines

There was **no intelligence** received regarding **County Lines** this reporting period.

## Drug Response

Information around **drugs** continues to be an **integral part** of our **AXIS workshops and interventions** and AXIS continues to work in **partnership with SORTED**.

## Missing Persons (MISPER)

**9 children** were reported missing of which **56% were girls**, during this reporting period. Overall, **14 Missing Episodes were recorded**.

**17yrs** was the **main age** of children who were reported missing.

The **main area of concern** linked to Missing Episodes was **Yeading, Cowley and Uxbridge** with **Eastcote and Hayes** also being mentioned.

**Common themes** continue to be: **being “out with friends/boyfriends” and travelling to London**.

The **average time missing 1-2 days or returning home late for curfew**.

**Looked After Children (LAC)** are frequently reported missing due to **curfew breaches, returning home late or family visits**. AXIS intelligence suggests that **75%** of missing episodes reported related to a child who is **LAC**. This is in part down to the robust reporting mechanisms of those who provide care for those children.

## MISPER Response

AXIS continues to work closely with **police, social care, and Youth Justice Services**, ensuring rapid information sharing and coordinated action to reduce harm.

There has recently been a **renewed drive to expedite Strategy Meetings for Missing Children**.



## **AXIS Group Sessions**

**AXIS** group sessions continue to take place across the Borough. Since the start of the **new academic year** **AXIS** have delivered group sessions to **over 136 children**.

**Feedback forms** were handed to children to capture the '**voice of the child**', these were a huge success with **90%** saying they **would recommend the sessions** to others and **100%** of participants saying they **would like to take part again**.

**AXIS** recently worked together with local business man **Eddie McGinty**, who recently received the **Bronze Award by Hillingdon Council for Helping Communities**, to deliver a session around **SYV** to students at **Uxbridge College**. Eddie was able to share **first hand experience** of his life in and out of the **criminal justice system** and provide **invaluable advice and guidance** to the students. He was also able to provide an insight into his **ongoing struggles** and how he has **turned his life around, now running 2 very successful businesses** in the local community and inspiring them to '**make better choices**'.

## **RADICALISATION AWARENESS SESSIONS**

**Prevent** have commissioned **NSTN (National Safeguarding Training Network)** to deliver workshops for **parents and carers on Radicalisation**. This will take place as an online session on **24th February 2026** which is open to **parents/ carers across the borough**.

These sessions help **parents understand how extremist narratives spread**, how young people can be **drawn in through emotional or social pressures**, and how **families can create safe, supportive environments that build resilience**.

Parents will learn **practical ways to spot early warning signs, support healthy online habits, and confidently challenge harmful content**.
