Academy21 is a leading online alternative provision (AP) provider in the UK, offering internal or external live interactive classes tailored to support students unable to attend mainstream schools due to various challenges.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** Academy21 supports primary, secondary school and A level students.
- **Targeted Audience:** Students who face difficulties in traditional classroom settings, including teenage parents, those in care, with medical needs, mental health issues, behavioural challenges and/or SEN.

Delivery:

- **Live Online Classes:** 100% real-time, interactive lessons delivered by qualified subject-specialist teachers.
- **Personalised Learning:** Tailored support to meet individual student needs, including those with SEN.
- **Flexible Access:** Students can attend from their homes, supervised areas at school, or other designated learning centres.

Timescales:

- **Flexible Enrolment:** Students can join Academy21 at any point during the academic year.
- **Duration:** Offers short, medium and long-term provision based on individual student requirements.

Packages:

- **Support Services:** One to one counselling and wellbeing courses in anxiety management and social skills amongst others for pupils in Key Stages 3- 5.

Ackerman Pierce offers specialised AP services to children and young people (CYP) facing challenges in mainstream education.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** Pupils in KS1-5.
- **Targeted Audience:** CYP at risk of/ permanently excluded, unable to attend school due to illness, those in care, young offenders, pupils who SEN and/ or

SEMH needs or challenging behaviour. Support is available also off-site to improve behaviour and for those are awaiting suitable school placements.

Delivery:

- **Personalised Tuition:** Tailored 1:1 or 2:1 tutoring sessions focusing on individual needs, including academic, social, emotional, and physical development.
- **Flexible Settings:** Sessions can be provided online or face to face in various locations such as pupils homes or other suitable venues conveniently located for CYP and parents/ caregivers.
- **Lessons are delivered by:** Qualified or unqualified teachers.

Timescales:

- **Flexible Duration:** Services are customised to meet the specific needs of pupils, ranging from short-term interventions to long-term support, depending on individual circumstances and goals. Support can be from between 5-30 hours per week.
- **Short turnaround:** Advertises being able to facilitate a placement **within 24 hours** of receiving a referral.

Packages:

- **Customised Programs:** Development of bespoke educational plans that address the unique challenges and objectives of each CYP, ensuring a comprehensive approach to their education and well-being.
- **Holistic Support:** Emphasis on re-engagement with learning.

ASEND is an AP service specializing in supporting children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). They offer tailored educational and therapeutic services to meet individual needs.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** Primary, Secondary, Post 16 and pupils with up to age 25 with an EHCP.
- **Target Audience:** ASEND supports CYP with SEND, including those who find mainstream education challenging and/or those with SEMH, behavioural, sensory, physical, communication, or interaction needs.


Delivery:

- **Face-to-Face Support:** In-person sessions conducted in various settings such as homes, schools, or community centres.
- **Online Support:** Virtual sessions to accommodate different needs and circumstances.
- **1:1 Sessions:** Individualized support focusing on personalised learning and development.

- **Group Sessions:** Small group interactions to promote social skills and collaborative learning.

Timescales:

- **ASEND offers:** Short-term and long-term support are available, depending on the specific requirements of the child or young person. The duration and frequency of sessions are customised to achieve the best outcomes.
- **Packages:** ASEND provides bespoke packages tailored to each child or young person. These can include a combination of educational support, therapeutic interventions, and mentoring. Content and duration are decided through assessments and consultations with families and professionals.

Aspire People provides quality tuition and supplies staff to schools and colleges.

Cohort:

- **Target Audience:** Pupils aged 4-18.
- **Student Needs:** Children and young people of all ages and abilities including those who require SEMH intervention, with additional needs, who have been permanently excluded and/ or are not attending mainstream education.

Delivery:

- **Tutoring:** Is available face to face on a one-to-one basis or as part of a group. This can take place within pupil's homes, schools or in a communal space such as a library.
- **Mentoring:** Focusing on building a trusting relationship with pupils to inspire and motivate them and to explore their options and a plan of action. Mentoring is also used to explore strategies for emotional regulation in challenging situations.

Timescale:

- **Duration:** Aspire People can offer short and long-term packages of support.
- **Start Times:** Aspire People endeavour to arrange for tutoring to commence within 48 hours of receiving referrals.

Packages:

- **Aspire People offer a range of additional free programmes** these include:
 - Functional skills
 - Art therapy
 - Transition support
 - Exam preparation and boost support
 - EAL support
 - Support for those who are NEET

Be My Tutor is an online tuition provider specializing in alternative education for children and young people with SEND including those with an EHCP. In addition to those with SEMH, speech, language and communication needs and challenging behaviour.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** Aged 7 to post 16.

Delivery:

- **Online Tuition:** High-quality, personalised teaching delivered virtually, allowing flexibility and accessibility for students in various locations.
- **Qualified Educators:** A team of fully qualified teachers, tutors and SEND specialists to ensure adherence to current legislation and best practices.

Timescales:

- **Flexible Scheduling:** Tuition programs are tailored to the individual needs of each student, with adaptable durations to accommodate short-term or long-term educational support requirements.
- **Time Scales:** The minimum support package starts from 6 weeks, and they can offer up to 15 hours of support per week.

Build School of Construction (BSOC) is an independent training facility based in Hayes and Hounslow, offering a range of construction-related courses and employment opportunities for both female and male pupils.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** BSOC caters to learners starting from age 14 to 25, with programs designed for school-aged students and adults seeking to enter or advance in the construction industry.
- **Specialisation:** For those with or without Educational Health Care Plans (EHCPs).

Delivery:

- **In-Person Training:** BSOC offers hands-on training in their workshops located in Hayes and Hounslow, providing practical experience in various construction trades ie. Plumbing, bricklaying, using power tools, electrics and solar PV.
- **Qualified Instructors:** Courses are delivered by experienced professionals committed to high standards of teaching and student support.
- **Home Education:** For young people with challenging behaviour home learning is an option, this involves a tutor going to the young person's home who sets theoretical and practical work to complete via one-to-one support. This also involves coming on site on an ad hoc basis.
- **Planned projects and trips:** Run throughout the academic year to support pupils learning.

Timescales:

- **Flexible Scheduling:** Programs are designed to accommodate different needs, with options for part-time attendance ranging from one to three days a week throughout the academic year.

Packages:

- **Holistic Support:** The institution emphasizes the importance of high levels of attendance and provides regular updates to families of students if their child is absent or late for sessions.
- **Progression Opportunities:** Students completing entry-level courses can progress to higher-level qualifications, dependent on their goals and achievements.



[Child Autism UK](#)

Child Autism UK supports children, families and professionals across the UK by providing training, support and advice. Some of the areas which they support children in are: communication, social skills, language, attention, and motivation. They also support schools in managing behaviours that cause harm or present obstacles to learning.

Delivery:

- **ABA Tutoring Support:** Child Autism UK are able to provide Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) tutors who provide support to autistic children.
- **One to one tutoring support:** is offered to autistic children. It is generally recommended by Child Autism UK that this is accessed for six months.
- **Duration:** Most tutors work with children for six to 12 hours per week.



[EDClass](#)

EDClass provides a flexible online AP for students unable to access mainstream education. It offers a structured yet adaptable learning environment to support academic progress, personal development, and reintegration into education.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** KS1- 4 learners
- **Target Audience:** Students unable to attend mainstream school due to medical, behavioural, or emotional needs; those at risk of exclusion, with SEN, EAL/ESOL requirements and those who are not in education, employment or training, (NEET), looked-after children and young offenders.

Delivery:

- **Online classes:** self-paced lessons combined with real-time tutor support during school hours.
- **Interactive assessments:** this includes settings being provided feedback to track progress.
- **Secure monitoring tools:** are used to monitor for attendance, engagement, and safeguarding.

Timescales:

- **Duration:** Both long and short-term placements can be provided to support with reintegration. They also offer longer-term options for students needing full-time AP.

- **Start Dates:** Rolling enrolment allows students to start at any time throughout the year.

Packages:

- **Curriculum:** Follows the National Curriculum and covers core GCSE subjects such as Maths, English, Science, History, and Geography.
- **Supportive Services:** Pastoral care, one-on-one academic support and adaptive learning strategies are available to help students.
- **Individual Progress Plans:** Customizable study programs with progress tracking and teacher intervention.

Enemy of Boredom (EOB) Academy is an AP specializing in creative education for neurodiverse young people, particularly those with SEN. **Please note that this provision can only be accessed by those with an EHCP.**

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** EOB Academy caters to students aged 12 to 25 who have struggled or failed in mainstream education settings.
- **Specialisation:** The academy focuses on neurodiverse learners, providing an inclusive environment tailored to their unique learning preferences.

Delivery:

In person courses are available in the following:

- Video Game Design at levels 1-3 in Bracknell, Letchworth and online- 39 weeks
- Music ie. Performance and Production. Students can receive an award, certificate or diploma upon completion. With a choice of 6 or 39 weeks available at either the Berkshire or Hertfordshire site.
- Business start-up in fashion available in Letchworth or online- 39 weeks
- My life, my way, life skills preparing for adulthood available in Letchworth or online- 39 weeks
- Functional English & Math's- at Hertfordshire *only*. Please note that this is a *secondary add on to other courses* mentioned above.

Packages:

- **Customised Learning Paths:** EOB Academy offers various levels tailored to different ages and abilities, ensuring that each student receives an education suited to their individual needs and goals.

Start times:

- Students can be enrolled at any time- subject to space availability- and fees are paid on a termly basis.



[Fast Forward Vocational Training](#)

Fast Forward Vocational Training is designed to be flexible and supportive, aiming to equip young people with the skills and qualifications they need to succeed within engineering and mechanics.

Cohort:

- **Target Audience:** Typically aimed at young people who have disengaged from education, that need an alternative route to gaining qualifications and employment.
- **Age Range:** Ages 14-19 but can vary based on individual circumstances and local needs.

Please note post 16 placements are only available to students who receive higher needs funding such as those with EHCPs.

Delivery:

- **Modes of Learning:** Can include classroom-based learning in Acton and Watford, online courses, workshops, practical placements, and work experience. The combination of methods is designed to be flexible and tailored to the needs of the individual.
- **Duration:** Courses range from several months to a full academic year, depending on the program and the specific vocational skills being taught.

Programs:

- Motorsport engineering
- Motor vehicle studies
- Progression to a STEM career
- BTEC functional skills- available at entry level and levels 1 and 2 in Maths and English- which can be completed alongside other courses.
- Students completing vocational courses are automatically entered in SEMH programmes.

Topics covered in the SEMH program include:

- Rights and Respect
- Building resilience
- Self-regulation strategies
- Managing anxiety
- Violence and consequences

Timescales:

- **Start Dates:** Intake dates occur throughout the year.

Fleet Education Services is a leading UK provider of alternative education solutions. They offer tailored tuition and mentoring programs to support students who face challenges in mainstream educational settings.

Cohort:

- **Target Audience:** Fleet Education Services supports students completing Primary, Secondary or Further Education struggling within traditional education settings due to behavioural issues, SEN (including those with EHCPs), SEMH needs and the full range of neurodiverse conditions.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** a variety of evidence-based approaches that is meaningful and bespoke to the learner. Tuition can be delivered face-to-face or online, either 1:1 or in small groups.
- **Supplementary Provision:** is available for education settings who would like their pupils to be supported on site.
- **Support Services:** Fleet Education Services provides attendance data, session reports, individual learning plans and progress assessments via the Student and Tutor Educational Performance System (STEPS).

Timescales:

- **Duration:** Programs are flexible in length, ranging from short-term interventions to longer-term support, depending on each student's specific needs and progress.
- **Start Dates:** With the capacity to accommodate learners across the UK, Fleet Education Services offers flexible start dates throughout the year, allowing for timely interventions and support.

Packages:

- **Individual Learning Plans:** Each student receives a customised learning plan that tracks progress, sets goals, and adjusts teaching strategies to meet individual needs, ensuring a personalised educational experience.

- **Examinations:** Fleet Education Services also offer curriculum examination entry at centers, and we can deliver Functional Skills examinations at home.
- **Mentoring:** Fleet Education Services can offer two types of Mentor Services; Progression and Attendance. The service can focus on developing study and/or life skills as well as career planning and independent living skills.

Fresh Start in Education AP offers a tailored approach to education for young people who may have disengaged from mainstream schooling who need a more personalised learning experience.

Cohort:

- **Age range:** Support is available for students aged 4-25, who require additional support and intervention to re-engage with learning.
- **Student Needs:** May include students with behavioural issues, special educational needs (with or without an EHCP), with social, emotional, mental health needs (SEMH), complex needs ie. Profound Multiple Learning difficulties and those who have been excluded/ at risk of exclusion from mainstream education.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** Includes small group sessions, one-on-one tutoring, which can take place virtually within pupil's homes with the option to communicate with tutors in real time.
- **Curriculum:** Covers all topics within the National Curriculum and other niche topics, although this may take more time to facilitate. **Please note that whilst they can support with GCSE preparation, they do not host GCSE's as they are not a registered school.**
- **Other avenues:** FSIE also offer Functional Skills, BTECs, ASDAN accredited courses and Vocational Tasters.

Timescales:

- **Duration:** Programs can vary in length and start from six weeks on an ongoing basis depending on the student's progress and the goals set.
- **Start Dates:** Entry points can be flexible, with multiple intakes throughout the year to accommodate new students as needed.

Packages:

- **Support Services:** Comprehensive support tailored to each student's needs, including academic support, behavioural intervention, emotional support

within pupil's homes ie. Sensory breaks and learning de-escalation strategies, and career guidance.

- **Individualized Learning Plans:** Each student often has a personalised learning plan that sets specific goals and objectives to help them re-engage with education and move towards their future aspirations.

Genesis Tutors is an Alternative Education Provision for children and young people who experience barriers to accessing mainstream education due to their social, emotional, and mental health (SEMH) needs or challenging behaviour.

Cohort:

- **Key Stages:** 3- 5

Delivery:

- **Modes of delivery:** Face to face or virtual support
- **Teaching methods:** Tutoring on a one-to-one basis

Packages:

- **Timescales:** Genesis Tutors can provide both short and/or longer-term support as required.
- **Individualised approach:** that is holistic, flexible, and personalised to each pupil.

HIAC

[High Impact Academic Coaching](#)

High Impact Academic Coaching AP provides one-to-one support to enable pupils to reconnect with their learning whilst supporting their personal development, self-awareness, emotional literacy, and resilience.

Cohort:

- **Target Audience:** Children and young people from KS2-4 predominantly with SEND - including those with EHCPs, neurodivergence, trauma backgrounds, or those in the process of assessment. They can occasionally support KS1 and KS5 but this would require a discussion.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** HIAC provide one-to-one tuition and mentoring. This can take place in school (if the pupil is still on roll), at the pupil's home or

community venue such as public library or any other appropriate type of space. They also offer support virtually if required.

NB: Support for Maths, English and Science can take place in person and online, whilst support for other topics is offered virtually only.

Timescales:

- **Duration:** Support can range from between 1-15 hours per week.
- **Start Dates:** Pupils can access support at any time of the year.

Packages:

- **Broad curriculum:** HIAC offers support with Functional Skills Mathematics and English, Business Studies, various languages and Digital & ICT Skills and more.
- **Personal Development Opportunities:** Opportunities to develop study skills, organization and executive functioning abilities are also available for pupils.
- **Post-16:** HIAC can support with exploring careers and offer transition coaching.
- **EAL Support:** Is a further option available to pupils.



[Home - JDS Tuition Services](#)

JDS Recruitment AP provides tailored educational aimed at helping young people who may have struggled in traditional educational settings.

Cohort:

- **Target Audience:** Aimed at young individuals aged 4-25 who may have faced challenges in mainstream education, due to behavioural issues, SEN, learning difficulties, SEMH needs, or who are NEET.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** The provision offers a choice of either virtual or face-to-face tuition within schools, libraries or pupils' home or the option for pupils to access support virtually.

Timescales:

- **Duration:** The minimum support package available is from one week for as long as required for up to 18 hours of support per week.
- **Start Dates:** Students can join at various times throughout the year.

Packages:

- **Curriculum:** Includes English and Maths at Key Stages 1-4, including Functional Skills and GCSEs. As well as employability skills.

- **Support Services:** JDS is also able to provide mentoring which includes emotional and practical support with developing communication skills and completing job applications.
- **Individual Progress Plans:** Each student's progress is tracked through personalised learning plans and regular reviews to ensure they are making the desired progress towards their goals.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** There are various programs of support available for pupils of different specific age ranges, programs are available for pupils age 8 to 25- for those with EHC plans.
- **Target Audience:** Pupils people who are not thriving in traditional FE settings, those with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs), with Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs. Learners with autism, learning and/or physical disabilities and those who have been permanently excluded.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** KCL operates a hub-and-spoke model, combining structured education, life skills, and wellbeing support in real-world and alternative settings.

They offer several approaches including:

- Group sessions
- Face-to-Face Group Learning – farm and hub-based
- 1:1 trauma informed Tuition –online, home-based or centre-based
- Virtual Learning – secure platform with live/recorded sessions
- **Subjects:** Functional Skills in English and Math's, Digital Skills, Agricultural Training and Land-Based Occupational Studies, PEARL Employability Awards and Independent Living Skills
- **Support Services:** Keyworker support and mentoring, therapeutic sessions, Sensory regulation sessions, and communication support.

Timescales:

- **Flexible duration:** 6-12 week courses, medium term placements (1-2 terms) or longer placements.
- **Start Dates:** Rolling admissions – placements can begin at any point during the academic year subject to availability and learner suitability.

Packages:

- **Inclusive environment:** With the aim of re-engaging student's passion for learning in a supportive environment where every student can thrive, and experience the joys of nature.
- **High-quality, personalised education:** To help students overcome challenges and achieve their full potential.

My Tutor AP aims to provide a supportive and flexible online learning facility that meets each student's educational and personal development needs, helping them to succeed academically and in life beyond school.

Cohort:

- **Age Range:** Pupils in KS3-5 Who may have disengaged from mainstream education, have behavioural issues, SEN, or are at risk of exclusion.
- **Student Needs:** Designed to cater to diverse learning needs and provide a more personalised approach to education.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** Utilises a mix of one-on-one tutoring, small group sessions, online learning, and practical hands-on training. The focus is on engaging students through interactive and supportive learning environments.
- **Subjects:** Offers a broad curriculum that includes core academic subjects (Math's, English, Science), vocational training, life skills, and personal development.

Timescales:

- **Target Audience:** Students experiencing disengagement, behavioural issues, SEN and or SEMH, medical and/or complex needs, other additional learning needs and those who are at risk of exclusion.

- **Teaching Methods:** Utilises a variety of methods including one-on-one tutoring online or face to face, workshops, and hands-on practical training. This multimodal approach ensures that the curriculum meets diverse learning styles and needs.

Timescales:

- **Student Needs:** Pupils with behavioural issues, medical and/or SEN- with or without an EHCP- SEMH needs, Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC) and those at risk of/ permanently excluded. **(Please note this is not an exhaustive list)**

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** Uses online teaching in small groups with a flexible delivery designed to suit different learning styles and needs.

- **Vocational Training:** Offers a range of vocational courses such as construction, hospitality, IT, retail, and healthcare. These courses are designed to equip students with skills directly applicable to the workforce.
- **Flexibility:** Includes flexible learning options to accommodate students' varying schedules, including part-time, full-time, and online learning.

Timescales:

- **Duration:** Programs vary in length, ranging from a few weeks to a full academic year or longer, depending on the individual's needs and goals. Some courses are intensive, designed for quick skills acquisition, while others provide a more gradual progression.

Cohort:

- **Target Audience:** Pupils aged 6-16.
- **Student Needs:** TLC can provide support to CYP who have been excluded, with EAL and SEND needs, struggling with Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA), those who are unable to attend school due to medical needs, or who may be accessing part time timetables.

Delivery:

- **Teaching Methods:** tuition can be provided on a 1:1 and 3:1 basis. TLC advertises that in 3:1 sessions with a tutor three students are present virtually but in separate break out rooms.

Timescales:

- **Duration:** There is no minimum or maximum length of support. Up to 17 hours of tuition can be provided per week.

Packages:

- **Virtual school for KS3 and GCSE students:** is available via live lessons with a maximum of nine pupils allowed per class.
- **Trauma informed tutors:** are trained to create calm predictable environments that promote safety and trust and de-escalate behavioural challenges.

- **Duration:** TP Tutors has no minimum requirement and can adjust the duration to best support each learner's progress.
- **Start Dates:** As TP Tutors operates on a flexible model, they can accommodate various start dates throughout the academic year, ensuring timely support for students requiring alternative provision.
