About ODET

Who we are

Open Doors Education and Training (ODET) is a Community Interest Company and a sister organisation of The Traveller Movement.

ODET was born out of the Coronavirus Pandemic in **2020** when schools were closed. The Traveller Movement saw an opportunity to reach children and young people through digital methods.

We provide young people with opportunities to access **professional digital one-to-one education.** Our online format has been carefully designed and we offer support every step of the way.

What we do

We offer **flexible education** that works.



About ODET

Our *vision* is for a society where the human rights of people from ethnic minority backgrounds is upheld and are social norms.

Our *mission* is to support children and young people to unlock their potential and provide and promote alterative or complementary streams of flexible education that work for them and accommodate their needs.

Our *approach* takes a human rights informed lens and each child's heritage is actively embraced and celebrated through our work.

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The Universal Declaration of Children's Rights states:

Article 28 – Education

Recognises the right of the child to education, and with a view to achieving this right progressively and on the basis of equal opportunity.

Encourage the development of different forms of secondary education, including general and vocational education, make them available and accessible to every child.

Article 29 – Aims of Education

The development of respect for the child's parents, their own cultural identity, language and values, for the national values of the country in which the child is living, the country from which he or she may originate, and for civilizations different from their own

Article 30 – Children of Minorites or indigenous

A child belonging to a minority or who is indigended be denied the right to enjoy their own culture.


Some details below:

- The programme involves <u>1 hour of additional support</u> every week during school terms for young people from Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities
- One-to-one professional tutoring, no group classes
- All resources are provided including a Tablet and wifi dongle if needed
- Age criteria <u>4-18</u>
- All tutors are <u>professional teachers</u> and are DBS checked. <u>All tutors</u> <u>have experience working with Gypsy, Roma and/or Traveller</u> <u>communities</u> and are trained by The Traveller Movement and ODET
- The tutor is the same week to week which aids building trust and rapport
- The programme is entirely <u>online and nationwide</u>
- There is no set curriculum, the hour is dedicated to any aspect of education that the young people feels they would like additional support with
- Our Education Officer is on hand to support the young person, their family, and tutor every step of the way
- Currently 100 young people on the programme



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

- Professional one-to-one online tutoring no groups
- English & Maths 110 hours
- Exams Level 2 (GCSE Grade C)
- Nationally recognised Qualifications
- Flexibility
- Ongoing support

Career Plan

- 10 hours tailored individual support with a professional
- Career portfolio co-produced with young person
- Internship opportunity
- 6 month check in on completion



Who is it for?

Criteria

- ✓ Gypsy, Roma or Traveller
- ✓ Aged 15-25 years old
- ✓ Not in Education, Employment or Training
- ✓ Speaks English or has a good level of written and spoken English
- ✓ An interest and willingness to attended engage in lessons.

Why?

Gypsy, Roma and Traveller (GRT) young people are more likely to not be in education, employment or training at 16 years of age.

71% of the Traveller community have experienced discrimination in some aspect of education.

90% of Traveller Education Services (TES) have been abolished


Level 2 qualifications are needed for most employment, educational and apprentic prospects


